Conference Agenda

The 2013 conference features more than two dozen speakers and numerous workshops. ADC's web site has a more complete list of speakers and topics.

Sunday, October 27 **Optional Tour**

The conference begins with an optional tour of the Washington, DC area, showing recent transportation projects including the MetroRail Silver Line and Intercounty Connector as well as the results of local land-use decisions.

Following the tour, a reception and buffet dinner start at 5:30 pm, followed by a debate over the role of government in land-use and transportation planning that begins at 7:00 pm.

Monday, October 28 **AM: Transportation**

Speakers will include Robert Poole on the future of the Highway Trust Fund; Ron Utt (Maryland Public Policy Institute) on the merits of and obstacles to public-private partnerships; and Randal O'Toole on reforming federal transit funding programs.

Workshops will cover such topics as how to show if transit increases or decreases congestion in your region; how to evaluate and comment on rail transit environmental impact statements; and how to influence Congress' 2014 transportation bill.

PM: Sustainability Planning & Land Use

Featured speakers will include Tom Rubin,

former Chief Financial Officer for CalTrans, reviewing the radical sustainability plan for the San Francisco Bay Area; demographer Wendell Cox showing how freedom, not central planning, makes cities prosperous; and architect Rick Harrison describing how single-family housing can be dell Cox more energy efficient than multi-family housing.

Workshops will describe how to challenge sustainability plans; how to use the traditional media as well as social media to spread your message; and how to participate in charrettes and other "public involvement" programs.

Monday will conclude with a reception and banquet dinner, giving you a chance to network with people work-

ing on these issues from all over the United States.

Tuesday, October 29 **AM: Grassroots Organizing**

DC lobbyists and other experts will offer skills and advice on lobbying, litigation, working with the media, and tips on persuading liberals and others about our issues. The conference will close with lunch and a membership meeting of the American Dream Coalition.
